

EDUCATION/ CONSERVATION BUILDING



The Ringling Museum's Education/Conservation Building provides 68,000 square feet of modern space to serve the Ringling Museum's education mission. The facility offers:



- Academic spaces for adult courses and graduate seminars, meeting rooms for teacher-training and professional certification
- Library to make available Museum's collection of more than 70,000 books, exhibition catalogues, periodicals and auction catalogues
- Twenty first-Century conservation lab with state-of-the-art equipment
- First-rate storage facilities with enduring capacity to preserve the Museum's priceless collection built above the flood plane
- Second-floor office wing centralizing Museum operations that was spread among more than half a dozen locations on and off the estate
